

In the News...

We are very excited to announce the newest memory care community soon to be open in Santa Barbara. Oak Cottage of Santa Barbara is located at 1820 De La Vina Street, and will include three intimate neighborhoods focused on providing personalized care for up to 40 senior residents. The program is tailored to provide empowerment, safety and comfort for senior suffering from Alzheimer's and age-related dementias. The project is now under construction and will open in March of 2015. This announcement has been a long-time coming. In 2009, Valerie Maldonado began researching ways to revitalize a property she and her husband Mark owned in downtown Santa Barbara. As with many families, Valerie and Mark had experienced the ravages of Alzheimer's disease within their own extended family and felt that



a project dedicated to the care of persons struggling with memory care issues needed to be the focus. After identifying a local management partner and architecture firm, both with deep experience in the design and operations of senior residential care, Valerie and Mark commenced on a journey through entitlement, underwriting, and now construction of what will soon become The Oak Cottage of Santa Barbara.

Much thought was put into the arts and crafts cottage design of the final building, including outdoor gardens, large welcoming windows, and three gracious common areas, or "neighborhoods" where residents will gather, enjoy a meal and participate in activities.

Ample parking has been provided for guest and family members. Apartments were planned to ring the perimeter of these neighborhoods, ensuring short traveling distances for residents, immediate visual cues and a sense of security for residents and their families. Each apartment has its own memory niche and private entry, a small kitchenette (with a counter-top, bar sink and refrigerator), high ceilings and single hung windows. There are both private and semi-private bathrooms planned, all of which are completely accessible to walkers and wheelchairs. Additionally there will be a spa-style bathing room at each floor, an activity kitchen where residents can participate in the cooking presentations, as well as visual and aural stimulation (musical and spoken work) to promote relaxation and recognition.

Working with McGeever Management as their Operations Manager, the Maldonado's have begun crafting a program that empowers residents to live life as full as possible. Bill and Julie McGeever, principals of McGeever Mgmt., also



own and operate Heritage House, an established Santa Barbara assisted living and memory care community located on Hollister Avenue. Building on the successful programs and amenities offered at Heritage House, Oak Cottage is going to offer a farm to table meal experience, outsourcing local purveyors and organic food wherever possible. Transportation will be available to take residents to medical and personal appointments, as well as social outings in town. There will also be an open invitation for family involvement. Multiple events held at the community throughout the year will allow children and grandchildren to come and celebrate holidays, family celebrations, and informal barbecues and get-togethers. Residents will also receive one on one attention from a fulltime nurse working with resident's physicians and families to ensure that medications are effectively calibrated, and that care programs for residents reflect not only their health care needs, but are also respectful of that resident's personal preferences, both past and present. The goal of Oak Cottage is to honor and respond to the whole person, and not just the disease.

The Oak Cottage Team will be distributing a periodical newsletter as the project progresses through construction, offering both updates on the physical plant and our evolving operations. Look for news on our growing team of professionals, local organizations we will be partnering with, and even treasured family recipes and traditions we will be integrating into our meal and holiday programs.

Our first ad campaign is titled "There is no greater love", and shows a vintage photo of a father playing ball with his two sons. We think that says it all. We know your family is your greatest treasure, and we only hope that when you need memory care services for your loved ones, Oak Cottage will be one of the communities you will consider.

Mrs. Maldonado's Chocolate Cake

Ingredients for Chocolate Cake:

- 2 cups flour, sugar and milk
- 2 eggs
- 2 t. of baking soda dissolved in the milk
- 2 t. vanilla
- 4 squares bitter chocolate melted with 4T. of butter

Instructions:

Beat for 7 minutes. Use (2) 9" layer pans. Bake at 350 degrees for 35-45 minutes.

Icing for Chocolate Cake:

2 egg whites 1/4 cup sugar 3/4 cup clear Karo Syrup 1 1/2 t. vanilla

Instructions:

Beat whites until they form peaks. Little by little add sugar, beating until smooth. Slowly add



Karo, beating continually.
Add vanilla and beat until thick enough to spread.



Construction Update


Construction crew busy at work forming the understory parking garage. Look at the view we will enjoy at the second floor!
